NEWINGTON COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS' MEETING – April, 2009 Summary of the Meeting

At 7:00 pm the meeting was called to order by Vice President Peirce. Board members in attendance included Treasurer Chip Catherine, and Secretary Rita Steele. Director Roseanne McLafferty arrived at 7:10 and President David Rundgren arrived at 7:30 pm. Secretary Steele left at 10 pm. Meeting adjourned at 10:30 pm.

One resident was in attendance for a hearing on a trash violation. Another resident was in attendance to address a letter regarding a nuisance complaint. Several residents were in attendance to participate in community forum and volunteer.

Email votes that occurred since the last meeting included updates to two parking policies, repair of the main drain and pressure testing at the pool. Both policies passed with 4 'yes' votes and one abstention. The pool repair work passed with 5 'yes' votes.

Committee and Management reports were presented to the Board. Votes by the Board included approving February 4, 2009 minutes, writing off delinquent assessments and late fees of \$1,832.73, approving additional recommended pool repairs at a cost of \$1,489, waiving any assessment for a trash violation on Lot 293, and requesting Lots 103 and 137 attend a hearing on architectural violations.


Old business discussed included additional maintenance work on the pool, the opening of an interest bearing money market account for operating funds, and the cost to add a street light on Lodge Court.

New business discussed included hiring a private investigator to gather information on a delinquent account, religious statues in front yards, getting neighbor's approvals on sheds, newsletter delivery, nets for the soccer goals, repair of the wall behind Red Ash Court, shrub pruning, and disclosure packet fees passed on to new owners.


Additionally, the Board agreed to send a letter to an owner that was in attendance at last month's meeting who wanted an opportunity to discuss his architectural violation and a letter to a home on Kitchener asking them to attend a hearing regarding the nuisance complaints against their tenants.



Pool Procedures 2009

Please be sure to read this year's pool rules as some have changed.

Last year, residents were informed that they would need to pick up their laminated passes in the Community Office. Many residents were upset with this new practice but because the pool staff were thoroughly understanding of the procedures, we were able to switch back to the old process. NCA does not know what personnel will be working in the pool office this year and will again require residents to pick up their Annual Pool Passes in the **Community Office.** Passes will be available in the office starting May 20th as long as the Registration Forms were completed properly, old passes returned, pictures provided, and everything turned in by May 11, 2009. The office will have a few evening and weekend hours in May to accommodate picking up the passes. Dates and times will be posted in the May issue of the NCA newsletter.

NCA will continue to use guest credits instead of guest passes. The pool's gate attendant will have the list of residents and their guest credits. The community office will continue to apply credits to accounts when the old yellow guest passes are turned in. The old passes cannot be turned into the pool staff. They must be turned into the community office.

Remember, to avoid a lost pass fee, residents must turn in last year's passes with the registration card. Drop all completed forms in the red drop box at the base of the NCA office steps.
