MEETING – June 5, 2013

Draft Minutes of the Meeting – NCA Pool House Meeting Room

At 7:01 pm President Jernigan called the meeting to order. Board members present were President Sarah Jernigan, Vice President Mike Smith, Secretary Beth Rodriguez, and Treasurer Louise Whitt. Director Matt Reid was not in attendance.

PRESIDENT COMMENTS

In an effort to make the meetings more productive, President Jernigan stated she would be timing each topic of the agenda. At the end of everyone's opportunity to speak, there will either be a motion, agreement to table the subject, or agreement to drop the subject from the agenda.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Treasurer Whitt made a motion to accept the May 1, 2013 minutes with a grammatical revision. Vice President Smith seconded the motion. Vote: 4 yes.

HEARINGS

Lots 287 and 515 were not in attendance. Lot 132 was in attendance to discuss his situation that led to an early trash violation.

COMMUNITY FORUM

A resident stated that one section of Kitchener did not get their June newsletters. The CM will follow up since there is a new delivery person. It was noted that some of the newsletters said May, not June. A board member heard a comment from someone else on how great the pool looked.

COMMITTEE/BUSINESS REPORTS

Treasurers Report, Louise Whitt

Treasurer Whitt stated it is only two board members on the budget committee. They will have a draft by the August Board meeting.

Planning and Development, Lou Tobat

Lou commented on what a mess I-95 has become with the ongoing improvements. Construction will continue through the summer.

dents saw action being taken by NCA, they would be less likely to be delinquent with their assessments. The Board was neutral on including this update in the newsletter since their belief was that it was not beneficial to a majority of the community or would not be looked at by those it was aiming to reform.

At 7:58 pm the Board convened to Executive Session and returned to open session for votes.

Probable Cause – The Board reviewed Lot 441 for probable cause for a hearing on architectural violations. President Jernigan made a motion that there is no probable cause for a hearing at this time since the shed has been repaired and yard improved as identified in the letter. Vice President Smith seconded the motion. Vote: 4 yes. The back yard will be looked at again to ensure it is well maintained.

Write Off – Summit asked the Board if they would like to forward a case to the collection attorney or write of the \$195 balance on a foreclosed property. President Jernigan made a motion to write off the balance due to the nominal value. Vice President Smith seconded the motion. Vote: 4 yes.

Recommendation for Non-Judicial Foreclosure – NCA's attorney is recommending stronger action be taken against a resident who is significantly delinquent in their assessments. The Board agreed to ask the attorney to come speak to the Board on this complicated matter. The Board will prepare questions and submit them to President Jernigan by June 20th. The meeting will be scheduled for either June 25th or June 26th depending on the availability of all board members and the attorney.

Regarding Lot 132, Secretary Rodriguez made a motion to not assess a charge for a trash violation charge. Vice President Smith seconded the motion. Vote: 4 yes.

Regarding Lot 287 and 515, president Jernigan made a motion to assess a charge for trash violations. Secretary Rodriguez seconded the motion. Vote: 4 ves.

The Board adjourned at 8:45 pm.


